#### **Check In Assessment**

Our Years 3-6 students have completed the Check-in assessment testing this week. The Check-in assessment is an annual online assessment for students in Years 3-9 across NSW Public Schools. Students completed a reading and numeracy test, Year 6 complete a writing test. The Check-in assessment results will be used to support the identification of students' performance in literacy and numeracy and to inform our next steps when supporting each student.

Improving student attendance is a key focus of the Department of Education and schools have been asked to raise parent awareness about the importance of regular attendance at school. Parents or carers of children of compulsory school age are responsible for ensuring their child attends school every day. When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier

Student attendance is reviewed and discussed regularly in our Learning Support Team meetings. Students whose attendance is less than 85% throughout the term are flagged and parents are informed so that we can work together to improve the student's attendance and satisfy attendance requirements.

A key focus this term has been on addressing unexplained absences. It is very important that we are notified when a student is absent and an explanation for the absence is given. Please use the School Bytes Parent portal to register an absence if your child is absent from school.


